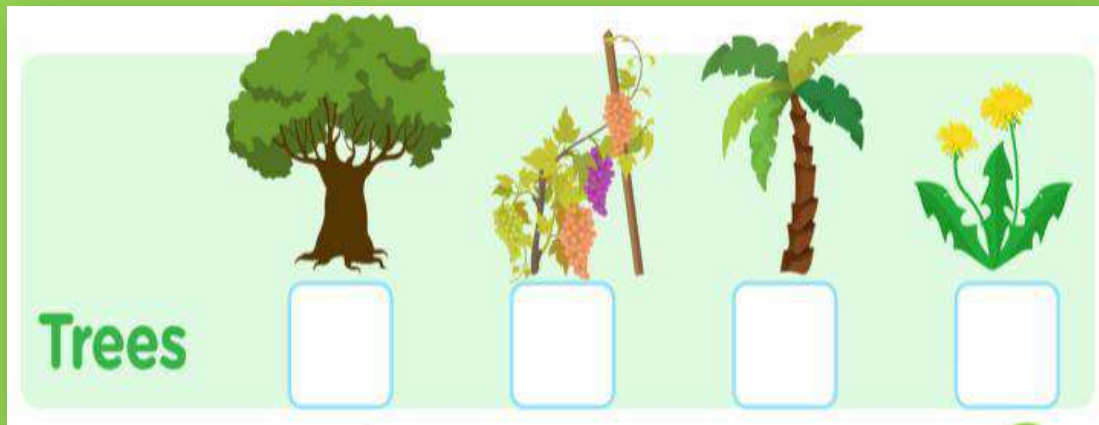
"THE WORLD OF PLANTS"

Plants are living things. They are green in colour. They make their own food in the presence of the sun, air and water. Big plants are called trees, e.g- Mango, Neem etc. Small plants are called shrubs e.g – Brinjal, Chilli etc. Thin, supple and delicate plants are called climbers, e.g - Grapes, Pumpkin etc. They need support to climb and grow by spreading.

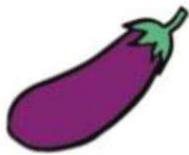

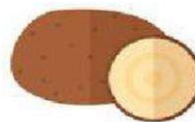

WHAT IS KEYBOARD?

- A keyboard is for putting information including letters, words and numbers into your computer. You press the individual buttons on the keyboard when you type.



Keys on the keyboard:

- There are different kinds of keys on the keyboard. We can type on a computer by pressing keys.



- **Alphabet keys** have letters on them. They are used to type words and sentences. You can write both capital and small letters.
- **Number keys** have numbers on them , numbers from 0 to 9 . You can type numbers by using these keys.



- **Space bar key** is the longest key on the keyboard. We use it to give space between two words.
- **Enter key** is also called the return key . It is used to move to the next line.
- **Cursor control keys** are used to move the cursor up , down , left and right.

AMAZING FACTS

- TYPEWRITER is the longest word that you can write using the letters only on the one row of the keyboard of computer.
- When you hit space bar , 600000 people in the world did just the same.
- The shortest space keys are found in Japan.
- Most keyboards have 101 or 104 keys.

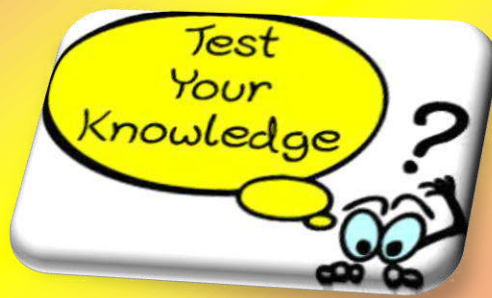
