Important Inventions Related to Internet



Sir Timothy John Berners-Lee, OM, KBE, FRS, FR Eng, FRSA, DFBCS, RDI, also known as TimBL, is an English computer scientist best known as the inventor of the World Wide Web. He is a Professorial Fellow of Computer Science at the University of Oxford and a professor at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Berners-Lee proposed an information management system on 12 March 1989, then implemented the first successful communication between a Hypertext Transfer Protocol client and server via the Internet in mid-November.

Vinton Gray Cerf ForMemRS is an American Internet pioneer and is recognized as one of "the fathers of the Internet", sharing this title with TCP/IP co-developer Bob Kahn. He has received honorary degrees and awards that include the National Medal of Technology, the Turing Award, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the Marconi Prize, and membership in the National Academy of Engineering.





Robert Elliot Kahn is an American electrical engineer who, along with Vint Cerf, first proposed the Transmission ControlProtocol and the Internet Protocol, the fundamental communication protocols at the heart of the Internet

SPECIFIC FACTS

- 1. While the internet was officially invented in January 1983, it had been in use since the 1960s as an Advanced Research Projects Agency Network (ARPANET), which was created to enable government researchers to share information.
- 2. The invention of the internet was also intended to allow the US Department of Defense to communicate without interruption in the event the US. experienced a nuclear attack during the Cold War. The invention of the internet became particularly urgent after the Soviet Union launched the Sputnik satellite.
- 3. While the creation of the internet involved the collective work of engineers, researchers, scientists, and programmers, Vinton Cerf and Robert Elliot Kahn were among the major contributors. As such, the two are referred to as the "fathers of the internet."
- 4. Although Nikola Tesla theorized creating a "world wireless system" in which communication could be possible without the use of lines in the early 1900s, Sir Tim Bernes-Lee managed to invent the World Wide Web in 1989 which made information wirelessly shareable.
- 5. According to the HuffPost, Mr. Bernes-Lees uploaded the first-ever photo to the internet through the World Wide Web after creating it. The photo was of 4 women that worked with Bernes-Lee at the nuclear research laboratory CERN.
- 6. Ray Tomlinson, an American computer scientist invented the email in 1974. Although he sent the first email to himself, he does not remember what he wrote as the message. During that time, the email could only support plain text as there were no formatting features yet.
- 7. Four years after the invention of the email, Gary Thuerk, a computer seller, sent the first spam email over ARPANET, as reported by Buzzfeed News. His aim for spamming was to generate sales for his computers.
- 8. YouTube was invented in 2005 on Valentine's Day by Steve Chen, Jawed Karim, and Chad Hurley. All three were former employees of PayPal, an American ecommerce company specializing in online money transfer.
- 9. On 23rd April 2005, Jawed Karim, one of the co-founders of YouTube uploaded the first-ever video on the platform. It was titled "Me at the Zoo", and it featured Jawed spending time at the San Diego Zoo.
- 10. Twitter was created in March 2006 by Biz Stone, Evans Williams, Jack Dorsey, and Noah Glass in San Francisco, California. During the launch, Jack Dorsey typed the first-ever tweet which read "Just setting up my twttr."



How we are governed?




The Constitution is a body of rules and regulations which defines the organization, powers and functions of the government as well as the rights and duties of the citizens.

There are three original copies of the Constitution, safely kept in special helium-filled cases in the library of the Parliament. The pages are bound together in black leather, with beautiful gold patterns.

Sovereign means an independent country which is not subject to any outside authority. No external power can control or interfere in the internal affairs of the country or dictate its foreign policies.

Amendment means any change in the Constitution of India.

Socialism means fair distribution of the country's wealth among all and providing equal opportunities to all, to bridge the gap between the rich and the poor. Secular state means a state which does not adopt a state religion and does not discriminate against anybody on the basis of religion.




Democracy means a government of the people, for the people and by the people. It is the longest written constitution in the world. It consists of 22 chapters or parts, 395 articles and 12

scheduled and an appendix.
